### Message from the Chairman

### Town Twinning - never more relevant than today!

It's been a while since our last newsletter, and for good reason! The hugely successful Europe in Harmony Choral Festival took a lot of time and effort from so many of our committee members, that there has been a bit of well-earned 'down time' since. However we are all now back, fully refreshed, and planning a number of interesting events over the next month or two, as you can read in this newsletter.

The Choral Festival went so well and our guests from Chantilly, Uberlingen, and Watermael-Boitsfort went home having thoroughly enjoyed themselves, not just through the singing, but also the home hospitality they were afforded, and the various events that took place over the three days they were with us. May I please say a big thank you to everyone who took part, helped out, raised money, or came along to see the performances. It was a truly wonderful weekend and the organisers, fully supported by your committee, certainly did Epsom & Ewell proud with their efforts.

By ironic timing our Festival took place just after the Brexit vote. For some, a Europe in Harmony event may have seemed a little at odds with what had just transpired. But I think those who took part would agree with me it was the perfect antidote: a chance to state publicly that whatever happens in the national political world, at a local level ordinary people will continue to enjoy harmonious ties and relations with their friends and colleagues on the other side of the Channel. Town Twinning is a force to be reckoned with, and will ensure that this always remains the case. The concept of Town Twinning has, in my view, never been as relevant or important as it is today.

It is my sincere hope that the government looks to revitalise the many twinning links that exist up and down the country to ensure that in a post-Brexit world we continue to have harmonious ties with our friends on the Continent. We may be leaving the European Union, but we are not leaving Europe. That should be the message we are hearing from on high. We are sadly not as yet, and so it is up to us to make sure that this message gets across loud and clear.

In Epsom & Ewell there will always be a warm welcome for our friends from Chantilly and we know they will reciprocate. The ties that bind us together will never be broken,

thanks to the years of twinning activities organised and supported largely by volunteers from our two towns.

#### Tributes from Twinning:

Many of you will have learned of the sad passing of Cyril Frazer. A former Councillor, Cyril was Mayor at the outset of Twinning, and was a staunch supporter right to the end. He was a regular at committee meetings and always supportive of twinning events. I am sad to think I will no longer enjoy his company during lifts back to Ewell. He always had something interesting to say, and had had a fascinating life. Courteous and kind, a real gentleman, Cyril will be missed by so many people. Those of us in Twinning are fortunate that we got to get to know him as a true friend.

We were also sad to learn of the passing of former Councillor, and Honorary Alderman, Jonathon Reed. Jonathon was perhaps best known for his work with the Burma Star Association, but he also served as one of the Council's representatives on the Twinning committee for a number of years and will be fondly remembered for his support and encouragement, and his kind and warm disposition. As an Honorary Alderman Jonathon will be given a Civic Funeral at St Martin's Church on Wednesday 2nd November at 2pm. Our thoughts go to the family and friends of both Cyril and Jonathon.
